October membership meeting

October's program featured the American South, in anticipation of our spring 2015 exchange to Raleigh, N.C., and Richmond, Virginia. Jan Kollesavich talked about Virginia, which holds a historic garden week each April. From Richmond, the ocean, the Blue Ridge Mountains and Washington, DC are all within a two-hour drive.

Helen Whetter described a trip she and her husband made on the Blue Ridge Parkway, a 469-mile-long road through the Appalachian Mountains. The leisurely drive offers more than 200 "overlooks" to stop and enjoy the spectacular views. There's ample opportunity to camp, canoe, fish and enjoy the outdoors.

One instrument closely associated with the South is the banjo. Our guest musician Ameena Bajer-Koulack shared a brief history of the banjo before playing a few traditional tunes. Although Ameena is still in university, she is an accomplished banjo player.

The first banjos in the U.S. were built by slaves in the 1700s based on instruments they had played in Africa. Ameena described the evolution of the instrument with different numbers of strings and styles of playing including minstrel, early jazz and Earl Scruggs style. She plays clawhammer style, which remained popular for generations in the Appalachians, and is always played with the fiddle.



In 1999, Bernie and I got to take our dream trip to Israel, Jordan and Egypt. We cruised the Nile on a luxury boat. Many Egyptians were also passengers on that trip. The dancers, singers and jugglers kept us westerners entertained but I never saw any of the Egyptians there. One afternoon, we went up to the top deck. There we discovered the never-ending bridge game and all the Egyptian passengers glued to the action. No one would speak, but all would circle to study each hand and guess to themselves what action the players would take. Make no mistake about it, Egyptians love bridge.
